Blended Learning – Parental Guide



The purpose of this guide is to establish a shared understanding of blended learning and the various formats that may take place with your child's education. All learners have been using the Office 365 platform and Teams to communicate with staff.

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All homework and work to completed outside of the lesson will be set via teams, using the assignment function on teams. If your child does not have access to teams outside of school, they should speak with their form tutor for alternative arrangements to be made.

If a member of staff needs to isolate the teacher will be available online during that lesson. This may be delivered remotely through a live lesson or support given online. If your child needs to isolate, work will be set remotely. They will be able to access the materials for the lesson and upload work to their teams account.

- ✓ Ensure your child has paper and pens to make notes with.

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- Provide support and encouragement, and expect your child to do their part.
- Struggling is allowed and encouraged! Don't help too much. Becoming independent takes lots of practice and teachers will be there to support.
