This has proven an excellent opportunity for pupils to get insight into a wide variety of different careers, as well as allowing them to have conversations about how diverse peoples' experiences in employment may be. This has been followed up with a series of options seminars where pupils have been invited to attend talks on specific area routes they might be interested in post education. This allows for breadth of experiences to draw from, not just at school, but post-education as well, allowing them to identify how the skills they learn at school can be applied in the workplace.

YEAR 11 VISIT TO NEW COLLEGE, OXFORD

On the 6th of November, me and some of my classmates were given the opportunity to visit New College in Oxford University. As part of this trip, we had a talk by a tour guide who explained some interesting facts about the College, what life is like for students who attend the school and how to become a student at Oxford University. Additionally, we were able to have a guided tour of the site from students who attend this college. As part of this tour, we saw the library, common rooms - where students were able to play games and relax - and the outdoor areas where students play croquet in the summer. From what we saw of the College it looked amazing.



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We were even able to see an area of the College where a scene in Harry Potter was filmed and the Chapel which is on the school grounds. 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VAPING SAFEGUARDING ALERT FROM THE DIRECTOR OF HEALTH

We have had 4 separate incidents involving 5 children who have used a vape and become unwell. It is thought the Vape may contain an illicit drug or toxin as when inhaled the children have become unwell and collapsed. The children received medical attention and support and are now well. At this time the 5 children involved are in the Caerphilly, Newport and Torfaen areas of Gwent. We want all parents and families across Gwent to be aware of this situation and be extra vigilant.

Should any parent be concerned that their child has used a vape containing an illicit drug or toxin, they should call 111 for advice or go to their nearest Emergency Department and report the situation to the police by calling 101.

Their content is relevant to the life experiences of young people and is designed to help them lead from within, whilst linking in with strategies to improve their mental wellbeing.












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SMASHED! - Live

KS3 Food and Nutrition classes

Year 7 have been particularly enjoying their fortnightly practical lessons and are quickly developing a range of skills to ensure their competency in preparing a range of healthy dishes, based on the Eatwell Guide.

Year 8 have been building on last years skills to create some autumnal dishes, both savoury and sweet, that use seasonal vegetables. Again ensuring they are contributing to a well balanced diet.

Year 9 Food and Nutrition have made a great start to the Street Food project, with a variety of sweet and savoury dishes being perfected before they design and make their own street food dishes.

Year 10 GCSE Food and Nutrition

Pupils have been experiencing practical and theory tasks to support the requirements of the subject specification. Pupils are also enjoy carrying out experiments and using scientific knowledge to justify the results of their experiment. This is great preparation for their GCSE assessment, some of which will start later in the year.


Year 11 GCSE

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


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Children in Need










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
