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MADRID








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
Year 8 Author visit




German Club

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JustB Smoke Free

Public Health Wales run a smoking prevention programme with schools, aiming to cut-down and stop people from smoking in the future through the influence of peer pressure and friendship groups. Alarmingly, research has identified that young people are most likely to try out cigarettes in Year 8.

PHW delivered an assembly to the whole of Year 8, after which they voted for pupils to become ambassadors for the programme. This selection process has proven to be the best way to find influential pupils - it helps get ambassadors that the pupils in the year group see as influential role models.

The 26 ambassadors then undertook 2 days of off-site training at The Rock and Fountain, giving them important skills and confidence to help them pass on information about smoking to their friends. The JustB programme fits in to the PSE curriculum and involves activities to help communication skills. The programme also works around making good choices and increasing self-confidence.

After the training days, the pupils will have four follow-up sessions in school to help them in their role as ambassador.







SALSA - Global Communications






Numeracy

Attendance




Diolch yn fawr to Chepstow Round Table who donated 40 Easter eggs to the school to support our Easter attendance incentive. They have been very well received by pupils.
