

Report from Chair of Chepstow School PTA - Helen Steele, Sept 2025

We continue to operate within the signed Constitution as approved by the ParentKind Association and signed in June 2021 at our inauguration. Copies of this can be provided on request by the chair or secretary. Any proposed changes or updates should be made in advance of the AGM. None received.

In the last 12 months I really feel we have established ourselves as a team and are now well known and routinely integrated into the school calendar. I feel we have grown in strength as well as resilience following our chilly quizzes and tropical BBQ's! We have routine with our annual and termly events and we have a positive reputation from our governing body, from within school and from parental and student support.

How the PTA is run

We are a group of volunteers with a mix of parents of students from year 8- year 12 as well as several staff and SLT (Senior Leadership Team) on our core committee. We met 6 times in the last academic year (i know it feels like more than that!!)

Our mission and purpose continue to be to arrange fun events for the school community that (in most cases will) generate an income . This income is used to purchase essential items for the school that benefit a wide range of, if not all, students and enhance their school experience which in turns increases their ability to learn and to do their best. I believe we are most definitely meeting this purpose.

The last academic year in summary:

We kicked off the year with our second Bingo night. As always we have a lot of laughs thanks to the ingenuity of our host Hannah and her wonderful calling and prize giving.

To spread out our events as well as hit Christmas with something other than a fayre we moved our Year 7/8 Disco to December and gave it a Christmas theme which went down well as we mixed in a few games which brought in extra income too.

In February, we ran our second and super successful Quiz night thanks to Steve Curran and James Hodkinson. Although we shivered through the evening, the quiz was a lot of fun. Caught off guard our quiz masters had to come up with a tie breaker as we had two teams with top scores. Based on feedback, I think it doubtful whether we dare brave a Feb evening in the hall again though.

In March - We supported our talented school drama kings and queens and served refreshments at the production of "Beauty and The Beast "and our audience enjoyed

alcoholic and soft drinks while watching the fabulous show. Following a discussion around UPF and wellbeing and Thanks to Sarah's time and energy spent in a variety of supermarkets and Costco outlets we had a new variety of snacks and moved on from just crisps and chocolate to nuts, flapjacks and milk shakes. It's not our role to influence but it felt good to offer alternatives.

In May we had yet another "Rags to riches" collection. But felt they were becoming too frequent so cancelled a couple and will try with just an annual collections. Next dates are 11th Nov 2025 and 10thNov 2026. Currently 25p per kilo, so perhaps need to shop around on this one. I'll be looking for a volunteer for this if anyone is interested.

Now on to our inaugural summer event. After a great deal of planning and preparation regarding ticketing, sorting acts, ordering catering, generator considerations, gazebo booking, risk assessments and local flier distribution we held our Summer extravaganza "Beats and Eats". It was well supported and there was a fun, energetic vibe to the afternoon. The sun was strong, the music loud and entertaining, the hog a plenty and the crowd were happy. It wasn't a huge money spinner but it was a success.

July was a busy month as always as we supported a number of end of term events:

We provided our extended range of refreshments at the awards event "Sports Personality Of The Year" (SPOTY).

Then finally the super busy sports day where in fact we had fantastic weather and were run off our feet. We managed to sell out of every drink and snack as well as ice pops!!We also secured complimentary fruit from Tesco which can be requested again next year and seems to go down well.

We weren't available at this years Yr 7 parents evening but we made our newsletter available to all our future parents.

On top of the events Kath has worked hard to raise the profile of the availability of pre loved uniform. We have spent many an afternoon in the dark cupboard sorting out donations and have had it on display at a number of events.

How the PTA has benefited pupils

In summary we had a profit of £6000 of which almost £5,000 has been reimbursed to school for items such as: sports equipment, library books, English books, cameras, annual app subscriptions for science, ALN resources, canteen seating and Golden Hour items. This is down from last years £8000 profit. Nevertheless this is a strong figure and has enabled the school to purchase these much needed items .

Our Key successes

Membership continues to grow on our Chepstow PTA Public Group Facebook page. We have more than doubled our membership in 2 years from 204 followers in Sept 2023 to 470 in Sept 2025. (359 in Sept 2024)

Easy Fundraising continues to grow but at a very slow rate. We have nearly doubled our sign ups from 45 supporters in Sept 2023 to and 85 in Sept 2025. (75 in Sept 2024) I did a push over summer to offer a prize to our 100th sign up but it had little effect. Still only half of those signed up ever actually click the button and of those 40, 10 have done it only once.

(In 2023 only 21 have ever raised funds. 32 in 2024)

Action continues to be needed on this as and as more and more of us do most of our shopping online. Top ten:

(BS £449, HS £118, KM £100, JH £96, AT £88, anon £66, LT £66, MT £64, AW £57, JO £46). I was successful in securing a banner which should arrive any day which school are happy to display. It has a prominent QR code on it so sign ups are made much easier. Watch this space.

"Your School Lottery" – we have 52 supporters, down 5 from last year which is a recent drop since our last year Year 11's have moved on to new schools/colleges. That said the recent winning amount is £12.60. Thank you all for playing. Again, ideas needed on how to get our readers and school supporters to sign up to £1 a week.

Facebook has been my platform of choice and I think you all know I'm quite active on that but I'm conscious that the next generation of students are likely to have parents who are more familiar with Instagram so we still need to work on this.

What is planned for the next academic year

With the success of 4 full academic years behind us we are a well recognised a highly appreciated part of the school. I am always open to feedback and new ideas to help us move forward with an opportunity and still keen to get the student voice more involved.

Pre loved uniform – has had a great start to this academic year with the whole cupboard ahving been sorted and dedicated to uniform and Mrs Amy Kite happy to be point of contact for requests.
