

We couldn't be prouder of our pupils for their hard work and commitment this term—what a brilliant way to celebrate success and spread festive cheer!



This event was a perfect example of how music and meaningful dialogue can come together to support wellbeing and inspire positive change. What a fantastic way to close an incredible term!


An Incredible End to the Term - iPad Winner!







Thank you to everyone who joined us and contributed to making the evening such a success. We look forward to continuing this partnership to help every learner thrive.




Science & Technology



Congratulations to Oliver who has been selected for the Cricket Wales East U13 Winter Pathway Programme, which is part of the national talent development structure for Welsh cricket.



A huge thank you to our amazing staff for facilitating these enriching sessions and making them so special for our learners.




Smashed Live Experience








Humanities

Year 13 Cardiff Crown Court Trip

On Wednesday, 12th November, our Humanities & Social Sciences students had the unique opportunity to visit the Crown Court for an insightful and engaging experience. The day was designed to deepen their understanding of the judicial system and provide real-world context to their studies.

Students explored the historic Crown Court building, learning about its layout, the roles of different courtrooms, and the significance of each space in the justice process.





ELECTRIC SCOOTERS



It's currently against the law to ride an e-scooter on a public road or pavement.

We understand that buying an e-scooter can be tempting, especially as you can buy them from many popular retailers.

WHAT HAPPENS IF I'VE BEEN STOPPED BY GWENT POLICE?

HOWEVER, THE CURRENT LAW IS CLEAR

You can buy one but you can't ride it on a UK public road, cycle lane or pavement. The only place an e-scooter can be used is on private land.

WHY IS THIS?

E-scooters are classified as Personal Light Electric Vehicles (PLEV's), so they are treated as motor vehicles and subject to the same legal requirements such as:

- MOT
- Licensing
- Tax
- Insurance



As e-scooters do not have numberplate's or signaling ability and don't always have visible rear lights, they can't be used legally on the roads. Section 59 of the Police Reform Act allows police to give road users a warning if they are reported to have used their vehicle in a manner which causes alarm, distress or annoyance. Gwent Police also have the powers to seize vehicles.

Please make sure you keep your e-scooter on private land so this doesn't happen to you.

Whether purchased by yourself or received as a gift, all e-scooters are illegal and can be seized.

- Never walk or play on ice.
- Stick to well-lit areas and plan your walks during daylight.
- Avoid walking or driving through floodwater.

- Keep calm and call for help.
- •Float on your back until you feel calm, then try to climb out.
- If you cannot climb out, continue to float and keep your head clear of the water.

KEEP CHILDREN AND PETS CLOSE

- Teach children to stay off the ice and avoid floodwater.
- Keep dogs on a lead near ice

IF YOU SEE SOMEONE IN TROUBLE - CALL 999



- Do not enter cold water, ice, or flood water to rescue someone.
- Assist from a safe distance. Use rescue equipment, something that floats or something that could help such as a rope or tree branch.
